

Brocklewood Primary School – The impact of the Primary School PE & Sport Premium

Intended & current spend, evaluations, reviews & next steps



Since September 2013, the government have provided additional funding to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and school sport in primary schools.

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE, school sport and physical activity (PESSPA) they offer their children. Schools have freedom with how they spend the money but each year must evidence the impact of the spend and should expect to see sustainable impact and improvements across at least one of these 5 key indicators:

- **Key indicator 1:** The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that primary school pupils undertake at least 30 minutes of physical activity a day in school
- **Key indicator 2:** The profile of PESSPA being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- **Key indicator 3:** Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- **Key indicator 4:** Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- **Key indicator 5:** Increased participation in competitive sport

Key achievements to date up to July 2026:	Areas for further improvement:
Brocklewood have once again been one of the most active schools in Nottingham City and have been awarded the platinum school games mark. (2026) This year 2025/2026 has seen more children than ever before taking part in an event, fixture, competition or festival and representing our school. (2026) Brocklewood awarded the platinum school games mark It is recognition of the school's commitment to the school games (achieving the gold badge for the past 5 years) and the school's model of PE teaching across school. Teaching alongside the PE lead - 100% of teachers and support staff have gained confidence in teaching and supporting in PE lessons (Questionnaire feedback) (2023) All children from years 3-6 have had at least a half term of swimming lessons helping the children 'recover' from missed time in the pool due to the pandemic (2023). After nearly two school years of disruption to out of school events, fixtures and competitions – This year Brocklewood have had more children representing the school than ever before. (2022) Continuing our work with the Youth Sports Trust our PE for LIFE curriculum has been launched to the school community – giving teachers a whole school approach to PE and children from F2-year 6 taught progressive fundamental movement skills in PE lessons. Working closely with the Youth Sports Trust a clearer intent of PE, school sport and physical activity has been established along with a clear learning journey in PE for children from F2 to year 6. (2021)

More staff are now engaging with PE, competitions and after school clubs. This has been achieved because of how highly PE & School Sport is now placed at the school and means less funding is needed for the sports assistant, as other members of the school staff are involved. This shows the incredible impact the funding has had in developing a sporting culture in the school and in developing staff confidence in the subject and this will continue long after the funding ends. (July 2020)

More Teachers are now able to confidently assess children in PE subjects thanks to the Teach, Learn, Grow (TLG) assessment tool (July 2020)

The sports assistant role in school has given PE, School Sport and Physical Activity the drive it needs to be a huge part of school life for the children at Brocklewood. (July 2018)

Teachers are now using a whole school approach to PE with broad planning enabling PE lessons to be progressive and build on from each other. This is helping to develop the children physically, mentally and emotionally. (July 2018)

School games mark awards



Awarded the Platinum school games mark for the second time. This is recognised for two years.

Awarded the Gold school games mark for the 5th year.



After the enforced break to the school games mark – Brocklewood have once again achieved Gold for the 21/22 academic year.



The school was on target to achieve the gold mark for the third year running before the award was suspended due to CO-VID 19. The school was awarded the 2019/2020 school games badge for it's provision in the Autumn and Spring terms. The school was also awarded the virtual award for the commitment to PE and School Sport throughout the pandemic in the Summer term (2019/2020)

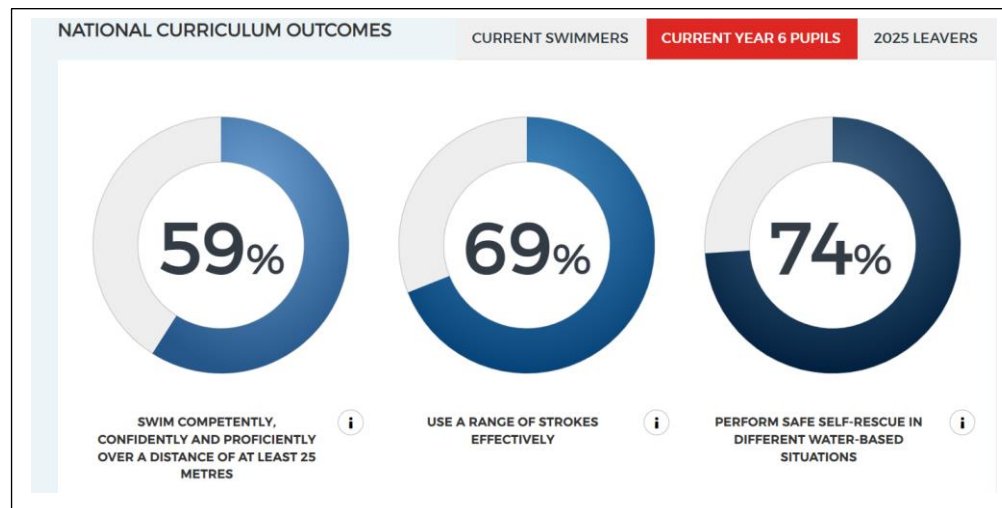
Highlights

- **184 different children have represented the school** at least one an event, fixture, festival or competition with many children involved in more than one.
 - **158 different children** have represented the school in at least one of the **29 School Sports Nottingham events we have attended this year**.
 - 36 different boys & girls have represented Brocklewood in at least one of the 28 school football matches 3 football competitions.
 - 19 different boys & girls represented Brocklewood in at least one of the 8 rounds of basketball fixtures.
 - 18 different boys & girls represented Brocklewood in a Transform Trust event. (Paceball and girls' football).
- **Brocklewood awarded the Platinum school games mark 2025/2026.** This award is recognised for 2 years and It is recognition of the school's commitment to the school games and giving children opportunities to be active and develop a positive relationship with school sport.



School swimming 2025/2026

59% of year 6 children leaving our school have achieved at least a 25M swimming badge. This is the highest of any leaving year 6 cohort.

Next steps to further improve PE, School Sport and Physical Activity at Brocklewood

- To further develop intra school events/leagues – to give children a safe environment to experience competition.
- To ensure a team of staff can run after school clubs throughout the school year to ensure children have a good range of opportunities
- To build further links with local like-minded schools that want to give children opportunities for positive experiences of school sport.
- To continue a vast and inclusive PE and school sports programme and to again ensure as many children as possible experience after school clubs and sports teams/events/competitions and festivals – To ensure we are as active as possible both in school and out of school.
